YMCA SUMMER DAY CAMP PLANS TWO WEEKS OF SERVICE TO THE COMMUNITY

Warsaw, IN – The Kosciusko Community YMCA’s Summer Day Camp, Camp Little Eagle has spent the summer celebrating and learning different themes each week. “Welcome to the Jungle” week featured a trip to the Black Pine Animal Park and art and learning projects focusing on wild animals. “Splish Splash,” week was full of water games and competitions, a visit to the water park, and a giant slip and slide. Coming up next week, the campers will be participating in “Summer of Service,” a two-week period immersing the children in community service and caring for the world around them.

Starting July 27 through August 7, campers will spend time with seniors in retirement homes reading and playing cards, and will play kickball for the residents to watch and enjoy. They’ll also visit the Kosciusko County Animal Welfare League to learn the importance of taking care of animals in our community. The campers will make a trip to the Recycling Center to learn how important it is for everyone to recycle and keep our environment clean. In addition to their acts of service, campers will do the classic camp activities: canoeing, archery, swimming and art and learning projects.
