Childcare over Christmas Break at the YMCA

Warsaw, Indiana- Make sure your kids don't get bored this Christmas Break; send them to the Christmas Break Childcare Program at the Kosciusko Community YMCA. Monday, December 21st through Wednesday, December 23rd; and Monday, December 28th through Wednesday, December 30th; and Monday, January 4th kids will spend each day jam packed with learning and activity. The program runs from 6:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. for children kindergarten through the 6th grade.

On December 21st the kids will be doing a craft, swimming, singing Christmas songs, playing dodgeball, and going on a field trip to see the Christmas light display downtown. On December 22nd the kids will do a craft and science project, swim, sing Christmas songs, bowl at the Bowling Alley, play a group game and watch a movie. December 23rd they'll play a group game, swim, decorate Christmas cookies, play Wiffleball, go Christmas caroling at Warsaw Meadows, and go rock wall climbing.

After Christmas, on Monday, December 28th, kids will play a group game, swim, climb the wall, play dodgeball, do a scavenger hunt, learn a science project and play bingo. Tuesday, December 29th, they will play a group game, swim, do a craft and go roller skating. Wednesday, December 30, there will be a group game, swimming, a movie, rock wall climbing, dodgeball and a camp team challenge.

Monday, January 4th the kids will do an obstacle course, a craft, watch a movie, play dodgeball, and visit the animal shelter.

Kids just need to bring a sack lunch, tennis shoes, swim suit, and towel to the YMCA each day. Registration forms will be available for children who are not already registered as part of our Kids' Club program. Pre-registration and pre-payment are required for all participants. All parents must sign their children in to Christmas Break Childcare.
